Impact

The Tornadoes and storms that hit the Ottawa area September 21st had a devastating impact for many people in the region



Low income families were hit particularly hard by the loss of power

The day before the storms hit was a big grocery shopping day for families using their Canada Child Benefit monies.

Most families and individuals who live in poverty are fridge dependent.

Food Spoilage was high.

Replacement of lost food items was almost impossible.

The Family House monitors power outages and community capacity to manage meals and any other issues.

Increased purchase of foods, fresh items begins immediately.

Distribution of large quantities of additional fresh produce and staples
